1 Willkommen!

Wir freuen uns, daß Sie sich dazu entschlossen haben, SetProfil auszuprobieren. SetProfil soll Ihnen die Jobsuche erleichtern, indem es Ihnen einige Arbeitsschritte erleichtert, andere ganz abnimmt. Beispielsweise können Sie Ihr Profil anhand eines übersichtlichen Baumes einfach erstellen. Die **Profilprüfung** zeigt Ihnen anschließend die wesentlichen Teile Ihres Profils auf übersichtliche Weise an und erzeugt einen Lebenslauf. Weitere Features sind:

- Erzeugung eines vollständigen Datensatzes für Jobsuchmaschinen einschließlich der Verwaltung zugehöriger Dokumente (beispielsweise Photos, Zeugnisse);
- Prüfung der von Ihnen eingegebenen Daten auf Plausibilität;
- Anlegen und Überwachen eines Accounts bei verschiedenen Jobsuchmaschinen gleichzeitig;
- Halbautomatische Auswertung von Mails von den Jobsuchmaschinen und Möglichkeit der Antwort oder Weiterleitung an andere eigene Mailaccounts;
- Möglichkeit zum Export des Profils als XML-Baum.

Sie können ein Profil auf verschiedenen Jobsuchmaschinen anlegen lassen, oder aber für unterschiedliche Jobsuchmaschinen verschiedene Profile anlegen – ganz, wie Sie wünschen.

Beachten Sie bitte, daß in der vorliegenden Demo-Release nicht alle Funktionen, insbesondere die Onlinefunktionen, freigeschaltet sind. Sie können aber bereits Ihr Profil vollständig anlegen – das Profil kann dann in die Vollversion problemlos übernommen werden.

2 Installation

2.1 Voraussetzungen

SetProfil ist in Java geschrieben. Daher benötigen Sie ein aktuelles Java Runtime Environment (JRE) ab Version 6u1. Diese bekommen Sie für die meisten gängigen Betriebssysteme bei http://java.sun.com/javase/downloads/index.jsp. Laden Sie hier das Installationsfile für Ihr Betriebssytem herunter und folgen Sie den Installationsanweisungen.

Weiter benötigen Sie für die Registrierung, die Mailfunktionen und den Kontakt zu den Jobsuchmaschinen einen funktionierenden Internetzugang.

2.2 Installation des Programmpakets

Erzeugen Sie ein Verzeichnis und entpacken Sie in diesem Verzeichnis das Programmpaket setprofil.zip.

2.3 Aufruf des Programms

Je nachdem, welches Betriebssystem Sie benutzen, starten Sie SetProfil mit setprofil.bat (MS Windows) oder setprofil.sh (Linux, andere unixartige Betriebssysteme). Beim ersten Start wird das Programm initialisiert und ein erstes Profil angelegt.

3 Benutzung des Programms

3.1 Menu des Hauptfensters

3.1.1 **Profil**

3.1.1.1 Neues Profil anlegen

Hier legen Sie ein neues leeres Profil unterhalb des Profilbaums an. Sie können beliebig viele Profile anlegen und später festlegen, welches Profil auf welcher Jobsuchmaschine hinterlegt wird.

3.1.1.2 Profil clonen

Sie können ein vorhandenes Profil clonen, d.h. mit allen enthaltenen Daten kopieren. Dann müssen Sie nicht alle Daten neu eingeben, sondern nur die, die im Vergleich zum Ausgangsprofil anders sind (beispielsweise Skills).

3.1.1.3 Profil umbenennen

Sie können einem Profil auch einen neuen Namen geben.

3.1.1.4 Einzelnes Profil löschen

Hiermit können Sie ein einzelnes Profil aus dem Profilbaum entfernen. Achtung: Ein gelöschtes Profil ist nicht wiederherstellbar, die gelöschten Daten sind verloren.

3.1.1.5 Profilbaum importieren

Hiermit können Sie einen ganzen Profilbaum importieren (beispielsweise bei einem Update, oder wenn Sie SetProfil auf einer anderen Maschine installieren). **Achtung: Ein bereits vorhandener Profilbaum wird dabei überschrieben, dessen Daten unwiederbringlich verloren!**

3.1.1.6 Profilbaum exportieren

Hiermit können Sie einen ganzen Profilbaum importieren (beispielsweise bei einem Update, oder wenn Sie SetProfil auf einer anderen Maschine installieren).

3.1.1.7 Profilbaum löschen

Hiermit können Sie den gesamten Profilbaum mit allen enthaltenen Daten löschen. Achtung: Die Daten des gelöschten Profilbaums sind unwiederbringlich verloren!

3.1.1.8 Programm Beenden

Beenden Sie das Programm stets über diesen Menupunkt. Der Profilbaum wird vor dem Beenden nochmals abgespeichert.

3.1.2 Jobmaschinen

3.1.2.1 Profil checken

Das angewählte Profil wird überprüft und ein chronologischer Lebenslauf erzeugt.

3.1.2.2 Profil versenden

Das angewählte Profil wird an die ausgewählten Jobsuchmaschinen versendet. Diese Funktion ist in dieser Version nicht implementiert.

3.1.2.3 Ergebnisse holen

Die Jobsuchmaschinen werden auf Reaktionen auf Ihre eingestellten Profile untersucht und die Ergebnisse angezeigt. Diese Funktion ist in dieser Version nicht implementiert.

3.1.2.4 Mails

Öffnet ein weiteres Fenster, das zur Mailbearbeitung dient. Mit SetProfil erhalten Sie einen

anonymen Mailaccount, der als Ansprechadresse an die Jobsuchmaschinen übermittelt wird

3.1.3 Extras

3.1.3.1 Registrieren

Ihre Vollversion müssen Sie registrieren. Dabei wird eine Onlineverbindung zu unserem Server eröffnet und Ihr Mailaccount freigeschaltet.

3.1.3.2 Onlineupdate

Dient zum vollautomatischen Update Ihres SetProfils durch unseren Server. Diese Funktion ist in dieser Version nicht implementiert.

3.1.3.3 Einstellungen

Hier können Sie einige Einstellungen an SetProfil vornehmen, wie den gewünschten Darstellungsstil, Sie können einen Webproxy eintragen für die Verbindung zu unserem Server und den Jobsuchmaschinen, und Ihren Weiterleitungs-Emailaccount eintragen.

Mail- und Hauptfenster werden geschlossen, der Profilbaum abgespeichert und das Programm ordentlich beendet (wie im Hauptfenster).

3.2.3 Mail bearbeiten (im Bearbeitungsrahmen)

3.2.3.1 Mail beantworten

Durch Doppelclick auf eine Mail im Listrahmen wird der Inhalt der Mail im Bearbeitungsrahmen dargestellt. Sie können ihn dort bearbeiten und durch diesen Menupunkt den bearbeiteten Text an den Absender der Mail senden.

3.2.3.2 Mail weiterleiten

Durch Doppelclick auf eine Mail im Listrahmen wird der Inhalt der Mail im Bearbeitungsrahmen dargestellt. Sie können ihn dort bearbeiten und durch diesen Menupunkt den bearbeiteten Text an eine beliebige Mailadresse senden. Als Defaultadresse wird die im Hauptfenster unter Extras – Einstellungen – Email-Adresse eingetragene Adresse verwendet, sie ist aber hier frei änderbar.

3.2.3.3 Mail löschen

Die Mail wird aus der Mailbox gelöscht und kann nicht wiederhergestellt werden.

3.2.3.4 Mail speichern

Die im Bearbeitungsrahmen befindliche Mail wird unter einem beliebig wählbaren Filenamen abgespeichert.

3.3 Benutzung des Profilbaums

Es gibt zwei Arten von Knoten im Profilbaum: Zweige und Blätter. Klickt man auf eine Zweig, so öffnet dieser sich. Klickt man auf ein Blatt, so wird das zugehörige Formular angezeigt. Wenn Sie das Formular ausgefüllt haben, clicken Sie auf einen anderen Knoten im Baum. Das Formular wird dann automatisch abgespeichert.

Einige Formulare können dupliziert werden, das bedeutet, man kann weitere, leere

Formulare des gleichen Typs erzeugen (beispielsweise Schule). Clicken Sie dafür mit der rechten Maustaste auf einen bereits vorhandenen Knoten dieses Formulartyps. Ein Popupmenu erscheint, durch das Sie entweder den Knoten duplizieren oder aber löschen können. Wenn nur ein Knoten eines löschbaren Typs vorhanden ist, können Sie diesen nicht löschen.

Beim Duplizieren oder Löschen wird der Baum aus technischen Gründen kollabiert.

Die Reihenfolge der duplizierbaren Knoten im Baum ist die, wie sie erzeugt wurden, nicht etwa chronologisch. Die Profilprüfung erzeugt aber aus allen für einen Lebenslauf relevanten Daten (Schule, Ausbildung, Arbeitsverhältnisse etc.) einen chronologisch korrekten Lebenslauf.
